Opposing the criminalization of low level offenses and taking an antiracist stance is profoundly imperative for the demographic I seek to represent. Black children make up 24% of our student population and Latino/Hispanic children make up 48% of our student population. This is the classically "underserved" population the peer reviewed literature discusses. With the dismal reading and math scores, these children are being primed for the school to prison pipeline. It is imperative that as a society we work to strengthen the social safety net and discover other ways to deal with societal challenges than the carceral system.

Properly funded and staffed U.S. foreign services that promote democracy and human rights around the world would help our school system more than one would think. The U.S. has meddled in the economies of many of our Central and South American neighbors- Nicaragua, El Salvador, and Mexico to name a few. A prinicipal driver for both unauthorized and authorized immigration from these countries occurs when their home economies begin to fold under regimes or policies often supported by the United States government. Many of these families who migrate bring their children to our schools. Many others birth children who are United States citizens and attend our schools. Approximately 20% of our student population are English Language Development (ELD) learners.

DPCCC Value: Education & Child Support Services

Advocates for high-quality, affordable child care; support programs for low income families including
access to parks and job retraining; ensures educational materials (textbooks, library books) are
inclusive, historically accurate, and reflect scientific consensus including age-appropriate, medically
accurate sex/gender education; replacing sworn peace officers in schools with trained non-police
personnel; Supports policies that respect students' civil rights related to gender expression and
addresses issues like gender-based violence and harassment.

I am ideologically aligned with everything stated under the header Education and Child Support services. Strengthening the social safety net through policy is fundamental to my reason for seeking a position on the Antioch Unified Board of Trustees. The children are our future, we must invest in them wisely. Right now they have been left to their own devices. We must provide the structure to ensure they can reach their full potential. Policies aligned with the presented value would do just that.

Creating policy that will develop well educated, civic minded children who can critically think will be the best support we can give to our veterans and elders. We are all interconnected. In our multi-generational home, we have actively shown our children to care for their elders in the ways that are feasible and appropriate. We live the California Master Plan for Aging including dignified living at home. These policies show the compassion in our society and will hopefully be a beacon to the children of AUSD. In addition, promoting equitable treatment and benefits in the military will positively impact our scholars who choose a military track post high school.

Housing is a human right. Coming from a family who were once campesinos, this strikes a nerve for me. My mother lived in tent with her large family as a young girl, while her father and older siblings worked the fields. They were often sprayed with pesticides and zoning restrictions almost prevented my grandparents from buying their property. Many years later, we have experienced six cancer related deaths in my family since 2012. The personal is political. I would work diligently to support any policy that would protect the children in Antioch Unified School District to ensure they do not find themselves in similar circumstances.

I intentionally filter all my decision making through an equity lens. I read books that expand my reality from a range of diverse authors speaking authentically to their experiences. I work daily to identify and overcome my own biases so as not to induce harm. The tenets of the Equality and Human Rights value as presented by the DPCCC is pertinent in that about 75% of our student population is made up of Black and brown children who, while not the minority, are often minoritized, marginalized and underserved. We see that in our very own school district at present with the metric that only two out of every ten 3rd graders are reading at grade level. This is the imbalance in our society that I seek to overcome.

DPCCC Value: Healthcare & Reproductive Rights

Advocates for the preservation of rights under Roe v. Wade, guaranteeing confidential and unrestricted
access to reproductive services without the need for consent or judicial intervention, ensuring
continued coverage of all healthcare options; Works toward implementing a universal, single-payer
healthcare system, while in the interim, seeking reforms to make Medicare Part D more affordable and
accessible, including the ability for Medicare to negotiate drug prices.

I believe it is the right of each pregnant person to self determine when, where and if to become a parent. As a health care professional, I am a proponent of single payer health care and abortion rights. The population I seek to represent (children in the Antioch Unified School District) experience the most sensitive cases and would benefit greatly from the freedom and discretion afforded them under the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA). The fact that politicians aligned with some health care professionals try to carve out abortion care and negate the fiduciary responsibility of health care providers should be challenged at every opportunity.

Support for Small Businesses and Entrepreneurship focusing on women, people of color, and those
with limited entrepreneurship opportunities including veterans; Support the rights of employees to
organize and Project Labor Agreements; Ensures a safe working environment free from harassment,
intimidation, and retaliation; Advocates for the establishment of local banks and credit unions, limiting
regressive financial operations like check cashing businesses and pawnshops; Promotes Project
Labor Agreements to protect workers; Supports initiatives to counteract "food deserts" by developing
local grocery stores and community gardens in underrepresented areas.
