a) 2025 Project: Has two links – summary and link to summary of 900 pg. document. Also a link that shows how Project 2025 has links to Trump.

9) Social Justice – Ray Cole, Chair

- a) Finishing up reading and reporting on the top 10 banned books from 2023; conclusions:
 - i) none of the books are, by any stretch of the imagination pornographic or obscene
 - ii) some are absolutely wonderful pieces of literature
 - (1) The Bluest Eve
 - (2) Looking for Alaska
 - (3) milk and honey
 - iii) the primary motivation behind efforts to ban books is political and organized. In May 2023, an analysis of book challenges by the *Washington Post* connected 66 percent of over 1,000 challenges to just 11 individuals; in August 2023, the *Tampa Bay Times* also documented the <u>influence of two individuals</u> in challenging hundreds of books in Florida. Many of these individuals were directly connected to advocacy groups. We should be sensitive to concerns of parents influenced by these groups who sincerely believe either that these books are pornographic or obscene or that they simply do not want their children exposed at all to topics they are uncomfortable with.
- b) The next focus area(s) for the Social Justice Committee will depend somewhat on additional members and there are two who have expressed an interest
- c) I am leaning toward the following for at least one area
 - i) Proposition 1 implementation, this impacts homelessness, mental health, and addiction and will have local effects
 - ii) Criminal Justice, specifically property crimes. These are the kinds of things that we are likely to encounter and the subject of at least two propositions on this fall's ballot.
 - iii) open to suggestions and guidance from the board
- d) Tractor Supply (we have a location in Brentwood) recently eliminated DEI (Diversity, Equity and Inclusion) staffing and initiatives as the result of right wing pressure and threatened boycott. https://www.washingtonpost.com/business/2024/06/30/tractor-supply-diversity-dei-climate/
 - i) While I do not support a formal boycott, I do believe we should be aware of the political positions taken by companies and choose where we do business.
