## 9) Social Justice - Ray Cole, Chair

- There are two potential committee members taking on homelessness and economic development. For *Economic Development* we have had one meeting and a series of emails with initial thoughts around:
  - Which area do we address, Brentwood? Antioch? Oakley? or a broader geography?
  - O What are the entities that are currently involved?
    - City Council (and within that are there committees within the council focused on economic development?)
    - County board of supervisors
    - Planning commission
    - Non governmental groups working on development
- Are there certain kinds of economic development we support and others we oppose?
- What kind of development benefits what people? i.e. do we want high income workers, middle class, working class, etc.? this may be key if we are looking at social justice impacts.
- Where are the gaps? Which area needs development? are there specific disadvantaged groups that certain types of development will benefit?
- What is the general process for economic development? who generally proposes something and what approvals does a project need to go through? this may be complex and vary by the location, size and type of business.
- The potential committee member has not committed to formally joining the committee and what he will initially focus on. Expect to hear from him within the week.

- For Homelessness, Karen Harrington has begun work on identifying the 'current state' of homeless services and is working to list the organizations and contacts for further information gathering.
- Ultimately, we would like to understand what the gaps are and what potential improvements can be made at the city and country level.
- My personal focus are is now low-level property crimes, things like shoplifiting, package theft etc. This area was selected because it is an issue that we are being attacked on by Republicans and because this kind of crime impacts virtually all of us. I am framing it up as a Lean/Six Sigma project (that is my background and it is a good methodology for process improvement). It is important to understand the current state and the initial effort will be around understanding what is happening locally with police, the courts, and other pieces of the criminal justice system. Attached is the preliminary project charter and flow chart of what I think is the high-level process, all subject to change as the project proceeds.
- All three of the areas the committee is working on, homelessness, economic
  development and property crimes, are broad and will need additional committee
  members to fully explore and develop recommendations. Please contact me if you would
