Jamie Jenett, informed us on the state of homelessness in Contra Costa County. On any given night: there are 2,277 people experiencing homeless in Contra Costa County, Shelter capacity meets only 28% of the need for single adults in 2019, and there was a 25% increase in homelessness from 2014-2018. She informed us of the available services in Contra Costa County. COVID has had a significant impact on homelessness and the ability to aid individuals. In response to COVID, Project Roomkey Hotel Program has been established. Jamie will send us a copy of our presentation and it will be posted to the website. It includes information on how to volunteer and how to get aid to someone who needs assistance

Update on Bart's Homelessness Issues

Bart is implementing Pilot Crisis Intervention teams consisting of a Supervisor of Crisis Intervention and Outreach Programs, a Crisis Intervention Specialist and Plain clothes officer (security). Bart is adding 20 New Crisis Intervention Specialists and 2 additional Sergeants and 10 additional officers (existing) The program will be evaluated for an 18 mo. period. Core Team (Coordinated Outreach, Referral & Engagement) – 2 workers every night on BART system from 4pm to midnight – They focus on End of Line and End of Revenue -Workers identify, engage and connect persons experiencing homelessness to services – health care, social services, housing.

Locally Fire and emergency services, homelessness, social justice: racial and law enforcement, and zoning (city growth and urban limits) The issues committee will be looking at how we will focus our efforts in these areas. It will be placed on next issues committee meeting agenda.
